
#### Our 6 values in school:

## The bell had rung and it was time for my class to head to the hall for lunch.






As usual we washed our hands first, heading into the hall.

Eating lunch in the canteen


I collected my knife and fork and then found out it was roast dinner day. My favourite!

I said he could watch me and I would show him what to do. Then he wouldn't have to wait for an adult meaning his food wouldn't go cold!


