## YEAR 1

Year 1 went on a winter walk. We completed a senses sheet about the things we could see and hear. We compared this to our Autumn walk. In Maths we have been learning numbers as words. One of our lessons was bingo. It got very competitive!



#### YEAR 2

In Science we have been learning about the difference between needs and wants for a human to survive. A human needs food, water, shelter, fresh air, exercise etc to survive and be healthy. A human might want a car, toys, clothes but does not need them to survive. This is in preparation for a visitor next week (mother and baby) where we will ask questions to find out what a baby needs to survive and how a mother has to provide those things.
