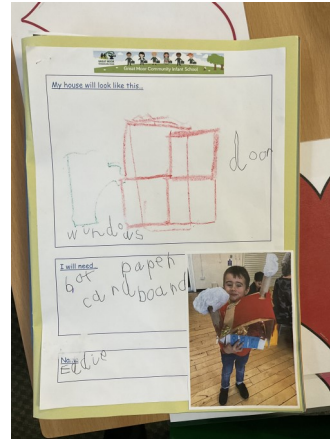
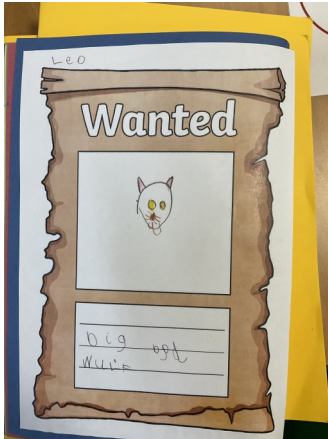


Some of the children have been developing their listening skills around the "music tree" thinking about how different instruments sound and learning the language "loud" and "quiet".
