It's about finding out about the past and how it's changed things for us today.






History in our Nursery & Reception classes is covered in the 'Understanding the World' area of the EYFS Curriculum.









Children are encouraged to understand the past through settings, characters and events encountered in books and storytelling. Engaging and practical activities enable children to identify differences and similarities between things in the past and now.



Our children develop an awareness of the past using Historical vocabulary related to the passing of time. Through Quality First Teaching, we ensure all children are engaged and involved in learning and discovery.

Our pupils use 'Knowledge Organisers' to support their learning of key facts and vocabulary. They are encouraged to look back at their prior learning to consolidate what they have found out.




