# WORLD BOOK DAY















#### **NURSERY**

In Nursery we have been continuing our learning about being inclusive and caring. We shared more stories to support our learning:

Mr Big is a story about a gorilla who feels very lonely until the other animals realise he isn't scary, he's actually a very talented pianist!

Hello Friend! Is a story about children all being different and enjoying different things but still being super friends.

Rainbow Fish is a story about how good it feels to share with friends.

On World Book Day, one of our friends brought in his favourite story about a Hospital Dog who helps others feel happy. He finds out how special that is when all the patients come to make him feel better when he is poorly himself!

We have talked about how we can tell how another person is feeling by looking, listening and thinking and how we can guess how something might make someone feel by thinking how it might make us feel. This helps us make kind choices that make others happy.

In Maths we have been learning about measurement for the first time. We have learnt the words taller and shorter and linked this to the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. We have learnt the words longer and shorter and linked this to the story of Superworm!

We have been making the most of the change in weather. How we play outside changes a lot when the sun comes out... Lots of us have chosen to try our hand at climbing.







# RECEPTION

In Reception we have been very busy producing our own Cress Diaries. We have been thinking about what the seeds will need to grow. We have scattered our cress seeds on to cotton wool and have watered them. We are checking daily for roots and shoots.

We have been enjoying dance with Roz this half term in PE. We will be creating our dances using all parts of our bodies!

We have been busy in Mathematics. Our focus has been on being able to subitise to ten and to represent 9 and 10 in different ways.


















# YEAR 1

#### <u>History – How have toys changed?</u>

They have brought in their favourite toys from home, they have explored the toys their parents/ carers and grandparents played with, and they've looked at toys from the past. They have developed their enquiry skills by asking and answering questions, carried out a questionnaire on their families and created a timeline of toys over the decades.



























### YEAR 2


In English, we have begun looking at the story 'The Bog Baby.' We have carried out a conscience alley, discussing whether it was the right choice for the girls to go to Bluebell Woods. We took ourselves on a journey to Bluebell Woods, 'jumping into the picture' and discussing what we could see, hear, and feel. We went fishing and carefully scooped (imaginary) bog babies out of the pond and discussed with our friends all its unusual features. We then carefully drew our Bog Baby, labelling it with expanded noun phrases. Great imaginations displayed by all! We will continue to explore this text until Easter.













In D&T, we learned how to thread wool through the eye of a needle, tie a knot, and sew a running stitch. We will continue to practise this throughout our D&T lessons, helping us to sew our final product our very own Bog Baby.
