Increase hours of teaching assistant time by 15 to support catch up groups/interventions	£ 8,677.00	Lowest 20% of key stage readers to have additional teaching and practice. Implement similar support for writing. Support a group of children to access the wider curriculum.
Purchase of chrome books	£ 1773 – contribution to Chromebooks <i>(Total cost of Chromebooks £ 8460)</i>	Enable all KS1 pupils to have more regular teaching of computing – bridge identified gaps and use to support learning in all subjects. Benefit pupils without technology at home in the event of a partial lockdown. Use across KS1 to support 1:1, small group catch up teaching – identified at Pupil Progress in Autumn.
Increase teaching assistant time by 4 hours of member of the support staff	£ 2340	Enable us to provide those pupils with a high level of need with regards to their social, emotional and mental health additional care and support within school.
Increase EYFS TA hours by 10	£ 5850	Support EYFS children to engage in and become engrossed in play by providing high quality resources and staff interactions. Develop pupil self-regulation, independence, language and motor skills.
